
FBI UNCOVERS HORRIFYING EXTREMIST READING MATERIAL IN MIKE JOHNSON'S HOME



Benton LA — The Federal Bureau of Investigation announced today that it had discovered terrifying extremist reading material in a raid on Speaker of the House Mike Johnson's Louisiana home.

"We were very troubled by what we found during our totally legal raid," said FBI Special Agent Curt Schampers. "When our tactical team breached the door of the home, one of our lead agents called our attention to a piece of reading material on the living room coffee table. The reading material appeared to be a thick, leather-bound book that had pages with gold-gilded edges. Clearly some type of radical religious text. This type of book is normally only found in the homes of truly dangerous individuals."

Eyewitnesses reported seeing FBI agents removing the book from the home in a sealed plastic bag for further investigation. "You could see the fear in their eyes," said Johnson's neighbour Darius Anderson. "I heard them talking to each other and saying that they knew people who read that book were radical, unhinged fanatics who believe crazy things and want to take over the world. To think Mike Johnson is a part of something like that ... it's pretty scary."



When asked to comment on what impact this discovery may have on Johnson's ability to serve effectively as Speaker of the House, Special Agent Schampers had only this to say: "This country would look a lot different if the kind of people who read that book were in charge of things."

At publishing time, the FBI refused to comment on horrifying reports that framed passages of religious texts were found hanging on the walls of the home.

Now that we are coming toward the end of the year, we have decided to break for harvest and Christmas so there will be no Shed Men in December or January but we




will start up again in February, giving you plenty of time to clean up the shed or the back yard (you don't actually need a "shed") and get ready to host your own Shed Men BBQ.

Things that can happen at church... aside from worship!

Jane Lieschke had some memories of a few incidents from when she and Max worshipped at Milbrulong.

Carol Bahr and I were in the kitchen at the Milbrulong Hall. We were the only ones in the kitchen at the time. Milbrulong ladies were catering for a Lutheran Women's meeting and there were ministers and the hierarchy there. We were told to boil the water before anyone drank it; so there we were: trying to boil water and then cool it as quickly as we could.

One of the ladies had brought along a beautiful cut glass jug and I don't know what possessed us at the time but we thought it would be a good idea to put the hot water into the jug and then we would be able to cool it quicker.

Not a good idea!! We poured the water into the jug and it shattered with quite a significant bang. Both Carol and I got such a fright and we both yelled "s@%#!!" at the same time. Suddenly realising the dignitaries were just in the next room, we both fell into fits of laughter, at the same time feeling a bit embarrassed.

Another morning we were in church at Milbrulong. All was going well, until we noticed a bad odour wafting around our pew. Jeff Gollasch was sitting behind us and commented on the bad smell.

No one could work out where the smell was coming from or what it was but it was foul. I told our kids to check their shoes to see if they had stepped in something and if they had not to lift their feet.

After the service, we were chatting outside and Max noticed that Jeff had something stuck on the side of his shoe. The Grand Discovery was that Jeff was the culprit. He had stepped in Doggy Doo. Mystery solved. We didn't need Sherlock.

Milbrulong decided that the ancient toilets (which simply consisted of long drops and sheets of tin blowing in the breeze) needed to be replaced. So, with a few donations of toilet furnishings and various other donations we got to work.

With a lack of finance on our part and knowing that approval from local government sources would be very slow and painful, a new toilet suddenly materialised one day in amongst the wattles. If anyone wanted to know how this miracle had occurred, the answer was, "The Toilet Fairy had appeared."



Brad Salzke also had a story for us:

This goes back quite a few years now, to a very hot and dry summer at Gerogery. We were attending a Sunday service at St Peter's on a rather hot and windy day. During one of the quieter moments early in the service, a beeping noise cut through the air. This jarring noise was followed by another, then another. The sound grew in pitch, frequency and volume as more beeps joined the chorus.

The beeps were in fact the Rural Fire Service pagers attached to the many farmers' belts throughout the congregation, alerting us to a fire started by a header that had hit some low-lying power lines while harvesting only a few kilometers down the road.

What followed can only be described as a mass exodus. About 30% of the congregation muttered quickly under their breath to wives and children and then stood and left the church in a bit of a rush.

After a short discussion outside, the decision was made to carpool to the fire shed as much as possible so as to leave enough vehicles at the church for the families staying behind.

As I was one of those that left the service and attended the fire, I can tell you it was quickly brought under control thanks to slightly favorable conditions, a quick response and a crop that had been cut quite short.

What I did not witness was what had happened back at the church. After the service ended and the remaining congregation exited the church, there was a sudden realisation that there was now a logistical issue: most of the men had been kind enough to leave vehicles for their families. What they had not thought to do was leave their keys!!

After some negotiations and probably quite a bit of laughter, it was decided that a cuppa, followed by a few trips around the district by the lucky few to still have car keys, would see everyone safely back at home.



Leonie Kohlhagen remembered a church and fire story from the Wagga congregation:

One Christmas Eve a few years ago, someone had the bright idea of putting real candles on our real tree in the Church. The rest of that bright idea was to light them with real fire!

A good portion of the congregation spent the entire service envisaging not only the tree going up in flames, but the whole church! As one farmer reported later, he was ready to race out and find a hose.

It did look very pretty though.


